## **SOUTH LONDON WOMEN ARTISTS OFFER GLIMPSE INTO THEIR WORLDS**

A group of South London Women Artists is staging GLIMPSED, an exhibition of sculpture, installation and work in 3D, at HOUSE, 70 Camberwell Church Street, London SE5 8QZ from 24 January to 5 February 2011. The exhibition is supported by Dulwich Community Council Fund.

Curated by the participating artists, the themes running through the exhibition evoke notions of locality, fragments, histories and memories, both personal and shared. Maria Beddoes work uses dining chairs inherited from her grandparents to create a playful family portrait, Daphna Alon's dangerous yet fragile House of Cards is built from steel blades whilst paper sculpture by Moira Jarvis represents a fragment of ancient farmland dating back to the Bronze Age. Other participating artists are Gin Dunscombe, Jackie Brown, Laura Moreton-Griffiths, Linda Duffy, Liz Dalton, Lucy Soni, Sara Mark, Susan Woods and Selena Jane Steele.

The exhibition hosts a special closing night event on Friday 4 February at 7.15pm with live performance, artist talks and open mic. £8 on the door (£5 concessions). The artists invite you to preview the exhibition on Friday 28 January from 6 to 9pm.

Over the past two years South London Women Artists have had numerous shows including a hugely successful exhibition at Bankside Gallery in April/May 2010. Established in June 2008 the group provides a web based showcase for female artists living and working in South London. They are committed not only to raising the profile of their own work but also to sharing their skills and enthusiasm with the local community.
